Steamboat Springs' Boyd named History Teacher of the Year

Steamboat Springs High School teacher Deirdre Boyd has been named 2018 Colorado History Teacher of the Year, according to a news release from Gilder Lehrman Institute of American History, the organization that presents the award.

The award highlights the importance of history education by honoring exceptional American history teachers from elementary through high schools, according to the release.

Boyd, who has taught social studies in Steamboat since 2001, now is among the pool of teachers from which the national award winner will be selected.

In addition to the award, Boyd will receive a \$1,000 honorarium, and the school library will be sent American history books and Gilder Lehrman educational materials, according to the release.

15-year-old with head injury airlifted from Zirkel Wilderness

A 15-year-old boy was rescued from Mount Zirkel Wilderness Area after he fell and received a non-life threatening head injury.

At 12:19 p.m., Routt County Search and Rescue was dispatched to the Gilpin Lake area to help the boy.

Classic Air Medical was dispatched to the scene, said Search and Rescue Incident Commander Kristia Check-Hill. At 2:10 p.m., the helicopter began to airlift the boy to UCHealth Medical Center of the Rockies in Loveland.

Check-Hill said it would've taken rescuers more than an hour to drive and four hours to hike to get to the

boy. Four Search and Rescue volunteers had reached the Slavonia Trailhead by the time the helicopter lifted off with the boy, she said.

The boy was on a weeklong backpacking trip with six other students and four adults, Check-Hill said.
