Front Range man's body possibly found

STEAMBOAT SPRINGS Authorities believe they have discovered the body of a missing Front Range man near a cabin in the Steamboat Lake area of North Routt County.

Foul play is not suspected as contributing to his death.

The 66-year-old man was last heard from Nov. 4, and family members contacted law enforcement Saturday, Nov. 10 because the family believed he might be at property the family owns near Steamboat Lake.

Routt County Sheriff's Office deputies found the man's vehicle on the property Saturday.

Search and Rescue volunteers then searched for the man on Saturday and Sunday but were unsuccessful.

Undersheriff Doug Scherar said plans were made to have a cadaver dog help with the search, but it was not needed after a Classic Air Medical helicopter agreed to search the area Wednesday.

Scherar said the helicopter crew discovered what they thought was a body,

and Search and Rescue volunteers then helped recover it.

Scherar said the body was located about 2,000 feet up a mountain across from the Steamboat Lake State Park Visitors Center and near the family's cabin.

Routt County Coroner Rob Ryg arrived at the scene and will be responsible for identifying the man and his cause of death.

STEAMBOAT SPRINGS Ikon Pass announced Wednesday that three resorts in New Zealand have joined its list of mountains around the world.

Coronet Peak, The Remarkables and Mt. Hutt bring the total number of Ikon resorts to 38 across four continents. Ikon Pass includes seven total days at the resorts, and Ikon Base offers five days. There are no blackout dates during the June to September ski season.

"Queenstown is the Southern Hemisphere's epicenter of adventure with all kinds of adrenaline-filled activities, including renowned skiing and riding at Coronet Peak and The Remarkables," Alterra Mountain Co. Chief Marketing Officer Erik Forsell was quoted as saying in a news release. "The mountains' terrain and vistas are only matched by Queenstown's legendary nightlife. Award-winning Mt. Hutt offers a big, friendly mountain with Kiwi hospitality."

The Ikon Pass, which was created in January, is a collaboration of Alterra, Aspen Skiing Co., Boyne, POWDR and independently owned ski areas.

Steamboat skiers and snowboarders have the option of unlimited Steamboat Resort access on the Ikon Pass for \$1,049 or five restricted days at Steamboat on the Ikon Base Pass for \$749. The Ikon Base Pass is blacked out from Dec. 26 to 31, Jan. 19 and 20, and Feb. 16 and 17. Both pass options include access to additional resorts.
